

# **Application**

## Waiver of Tipping Fees for Flood Impacted Properties

With the recognition that our community is grappling with extensive and ongoing damage from the flooding, the Province announced a process for the reimbursement of tipping fees that allows disposal facilities to issue a waiver of tipping fees for waste material confirmed to be directly attributed to flood damage. The City of Chilliwack is inviting flood impacted property owners/ tenants to apply for a waiver of tipping fees for loads of this waste material brought to the Bailey Landfill (5940 Matheson Road).

#### **SECTION A: ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

- 1. The address of the flood impacted property is within a known impact zone identified by the affected municipality.
- 2. The waste material is confirmed to be directly attributed to flood damage.
- 3. The waste material is received within a 90-day period from the last date of flooding identified by the affected municipality. Residents will be advised of any provincial extensions to this timeline.
- 4. Waste material brought to the Bailey Landfill should be separated as follows:
  - Clean wood branches, sticks, trees, clean dimensional lumber
  - Metal major appliances (fridges & freezers separate please empty contents), furniture, and other metal for recycling
  - Gypsum/drywall drywall can be recycled as long as it doesn't contain asbestos (see next item)
  - Asbestos containing materials pre-1990 drywall, insulation and other building materials may contain asbestos and require special handling and disposal, see <a href="mailto:chilliwack.com/landfill">chilliwack.com/landfill</a> for details
  - Propane tanks
  - Clean soil, rocks, sod and small concrete (no rebar)
  - Other garbage includes carpets, underlay, rugs, books, furniture, clothes and non-asbestos insulation
- 5. Product Stewardship Materials, such as paint, tires, electronics, small appliances and power tools, household hazardous waste etc. must be separated from the waste material and dropped off for recycling at eligible recycling/bottle depot locations. Where possible, household recyclables such as plastic, metal and glass containers, paper and cardboard etc. should also be separated for recycling through a recycling/bottle depot. Refer to attached City of Chilliwack Quick Guide for Disposal of Flood Debris (residents outside Chilliwack will need to confirm local recycling locations within their jurisdiction).
- 6. Please review other information for the Bailey Landfill at chilliwack.com/landfill.
- 7. An application must be submitted and approved prior to bringing material to the landfill for free disposal.

### **DISPOSING OF MATERIALS AFTER A FLOOD**

The task of cleaning up your home after a flood can be daunting. Here are some pointers which can help with the process.

Please sort your materials prior to bringing them for disposal/recycling. Flood water can be contaminated; please spray off or wipe down recyclable materials before drop off.
