

2010 SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS ADMINISTERED BY THE CHILLIWACK FOUNDATION

The following scholarships require student application. Application forms are available at schools with Grade 12.

F. CLIFFORD BROWN SCHOLARSHIP 14 awards of \$1,500

Clifford Brown established the first scholarship fund with the Chilliwack Foundation. He was deeply committed to post secondary education and wanted to offer prestigious scholarships to graduating students in the Chilliwack area. These scholarships are granted to top academic students with distinguished secondary school careers.

B.C. SUMMER GAMES LEGACY AWARDS 5 awards of \$1,000

The Board of Directors of the B.C. Summer Games, held in Chilliwack in 1993, established this scholarship fund at the conclusion of the games to honour graduating students who have given exceptional service to their community, maintained a high academic standing and demonstrated real leadership skills.

LUSCOMBE/VON BYLBURG AWARD 5 awards of \$550

Lori Luscombe and Kathleen Von Bylburg were chosen Miss Chilliwack and Miss Greenheart in 1984 to represent our community as goodwill ambassadors throughout the province. En route to an event in the Okanagan, their airplane crashed and both young women were killed. The District of Chilliwack established this award fund to honour their memory and to reward graduating students with an exemplary history of community service and a good academic standing.

JACK WILLIAMS MEMORIAL AWARD 4 awards of \$1,200

Jack Williams, a prominent member of the Chilliwack business community, bequeathed funds to the Chilliwack Foundation in his will. These awards are given to recognize graduating students who have had distinguished secondary school careers.

BOWES EDUCATION AWARD 3 awards of \$900

Mr. Edward Bowes, a prominent member of the Chilliwack business community, wished to remember the community in a meaningful way. He bequeathed this fund for the provision of scholarships to assist in any type of educational endeavor; not limited to colleges or universities, but also to extend to technical schools and other similar education training institutions.

FRANK GEORGE MEMORIAL AWARD 2 award of \$650

Frank George left a bequest to the Foundation in order to establish funds in perpetuity that will provide bursaries to outstanding graduates pursuing post secondary education.

Recipients of the following awards are selected by their school, based on merit. No application is required.

DR. ANNE AND SAM SUSSEL SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIP 2 awards of \$400

The Dr. Anne Sussel Science Scholarship Fund was established with the Foundation by the Sussel family to provide two scholarships; one to each of the Senior Secondary Schools in Chilliwack. These awards go to the top female student at each secondary school going on to a post-secondary degree in science.

JOHN AND JOY HELDERS PERFORMING ARTS AWARD 6 awards of \$1,000

The Helder established this fund with the Foundation to provide annual awards to graduates of the Senior Secondary Schools in Chilliwack who show outstanding talent and future career potential in any one of the performing arts and are going on to postsecondary studies in their field. June, 2005 will be the first time this award is available.

**DR. "TONY" NEWBY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (Sardis Secondary School only)
2 awards of \$1,400**

This fund, established in 1990 by Maxwell and Gail Newby, in memory of Chilliwack Dentist, Dr. "Tony" Newby, who passed away in 1985. Each year the award is given to a male and a female graduating student of Sardis Secondary School with good academic skills, leadership abilities and athletic participation.

DON URQUHART McGILLIVRAY MEMORIAL AWARD 1 award of \$700

Mrs. Beth Little left a bequest which is named in honour of her father. This scholarship is to be awarded to graduates to assist in the pursuit of a post secondary education.
